Thank you for the information sent to us concerning Mr Anil Agarwal and the operations of Vedanta in the region of Orissa, India.

This was not made known to us by the nominating body, nor did it arise during the review phase of process, and we send our sincerest appreciation to you for alerting us.

We have advised Mr Agarwal that subsequently, the Foundation is no longer able to present the award to him. Neither Mr. Agarwal, nor any representative from Vedanta, shall be in Oslo on May 7. and all references to Mr Agarwal have been removed from our Honouree materials. One announcement in IHT for Scandinavia did include his name last Monday, but this will be amended in coming announcements.

The information communicated to us by Amnesty International has been sent to the ICC nominating body in India.

On behalf of the Business for Peace Foundation, we extend our sincerest thanks for alerting us to the situation.
